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

Introduction.

The Memoirs of the Geological Survey describe and explain the features shown upon the maps, frequently with the aid of illustrative sections and sketches. They also include notes on the economic resources of each district. Occasionally, for convenience of description, one memoir covers two or more adjacent sheets of the map.

The MAP, on the scale of one inch to one mile, is divided into 205 sheets, coloured by hand, the basis being the maps of the Ordnance Survey. In northern areas, the hill-shading is shown as well as the geological features. The "Drift Maps," at present in course of publication, are colour-printed, the heights being shown by contour-lines where these are available. On Drift Maps the superficial deposits, boulder-clay, gravel, &c., are separately represented, the boundaries of the underlying rock-formations being shown by dotted lines, when they are concealed by a covering of such deposits.

For a few areas of economic importance, maps have been issued on the scale of six inches to one mile. Manuscript maps of other areas on this scale, including the notes made on them by the Geologists in the field, are kept for reference in the Office of the

LONGITUDINAL or "HORIZONTAL" SECTIONS show the structure of a district as it would appear if cut across along a particular line. The lines selected are marked upon the one-inch sheets. The Sections are issued coloured by hand, and are drawn on the scale of six inches to one mile for both vertical and horizontal measurements. They thus give a true picture of the form of the surface of the district traversed, and also express the conclusions reached as to its underlying geological structure.

The MAPS and MEMOIRS are now issued by the Ordnance Survey.
